American Ideals & Ingenuity

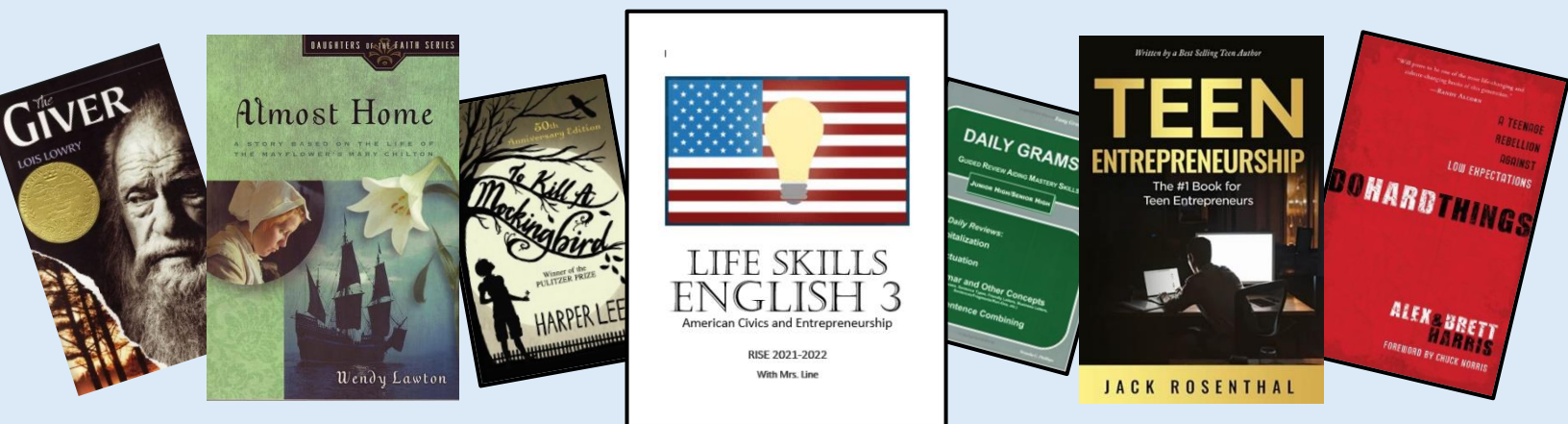
Life Skills English 3 prepares 8-12th grade students to sharpen business and communication related skills while exploring the blessings and responsibilities of being an American citizen. Skills English 1 and 2 are not pre-requisites for Life Skills English 3. Students in Life Skills English 3:

- Create and present a business plan
- Design and present a website
- Develop charitable fund-raising communications
- Recover grammar and usage skills
- Read and respond to four inspirational works of American literature
