American Ideals & Ingenuity

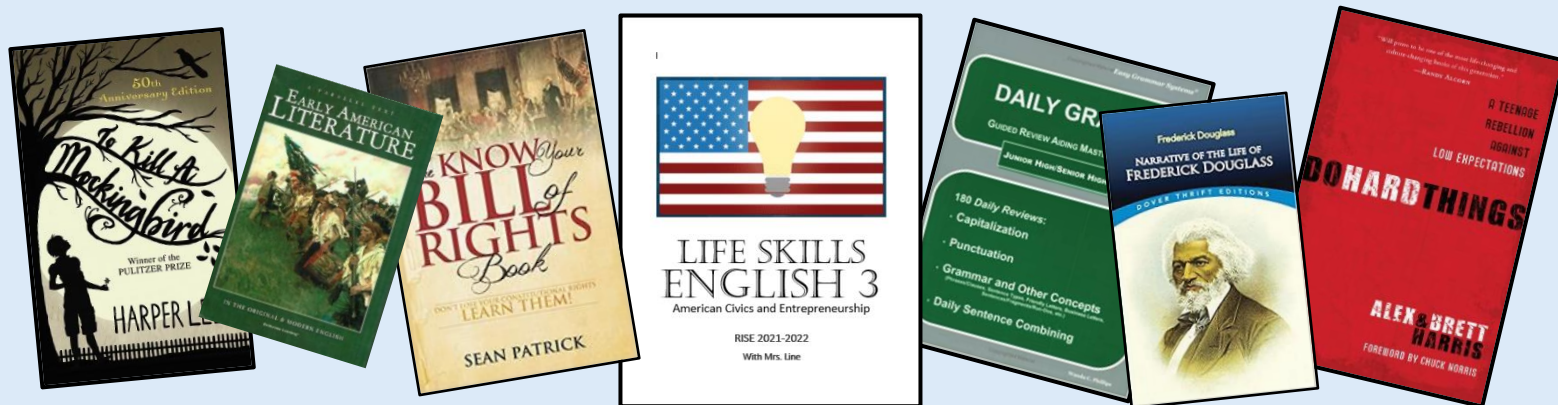
Life Skills English 3 prepares 9-12th grade students to be responsible citizens and effective entrepreneurs beyond high school. Life Skills English 1 and 2 are not pre-requisites for Life Skills English 3. Students in Life Skills English 3:

- Sharpen expository strategies for written and oral presentations.
- Develop charitable and business-related fund-raising communications.
- Write a business plan and design a related website.
- Recover lapsed grammar and usage skills.
- Read and respond to four inspirational works of American literature.

Mrs. Line, a degreed English teacher and curriculum writer, evaluates written assignments, tracks assignment scores, and provides parents with private online access to student scores.
